

Instructions for Patients Having Cataract Surgery

Any time	If you are sick or are on any antibiotics when your surgery is scheduled, please let us know as soon as possible.
14 Days	□ Please stop all GLP-1 agonists (Glucagon-like peptide-1) and weight loss
14 Days before	
	medications 14 days before your surgery date, even if they are prescribed for
surgery	diabetic care. (See list provided at Pre-Op)
	☐ Discontinue use of make-up, mascara, lotion, sunscreen, and/or creams to the face.
	☐ Apply warm compresses (such as Nummies, warm washcloth, etc) to your
3 Days	eyelids and allow the compress to sit for at least 5 minutes. This needs to be
before	done nightly.
surgery	☐ Following the warm compress, while keeping your eyes closed, gently cleanse
	around your eye to include your upper and lower eyelids (recommended with
	OcuSoft Lid Scrubs or a mild unscented soap). This needs to be done nightly.
	☐ Follow with a rinse of warm water. This needs to be done nightly.
2 Days	A surgery coordinator will call you with your check-in time for surgery. Please do
before	NOT use the times on the Patient Portal. Those are estimated times of the surgery,
surgery	not check-in times.
1 Day before surgery	□ Coumadin / Warfarin Patients: You will need to have an INR drawn within 24
	hours prior to your procedure, with a result of under 3.0.
	□ Eat light meals.
	☐ Avoid alcohol, cannabis, and other narcotic medications unless it is deemed
	necessary by your Primary Care Physician.
	□ Plan to have someone other than yourself drive you to and from your
	procedure. It is required by the surgery center that you have transportation
	arrangements after surgery, and public transportation <u>may not</u> be substituted.
	Your ride is required to stay at the surgery center throughout the duration of
	your visit. (2-3 hours)
	□ Nothing to eat or drink 8 hours before your check-in time. This includes
	candy, gum, cough drops, mints, etc.
Day of	☐ Take all medications as normal with a sip of water, except oral and injectable
Surgery	diabetic medications. Please contact the surgery center for further
	instructions.
	☐ Wear loose, comfortable clothing, preferably something that buttons, clasps, or
	zips over your torso so the surgical team can easily place EKG leads on your
	upper chest and lower belly.
	☐ If you use oxygen, please bring your portable unit with you.
	☐ Bring the cataract post-operative kit, eye drops, instructions, photo ID,
	insurance cards, and applicable copays.



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	☐ You will be using eye drops for several weeks after surgery. On the day of
A 54 a w	your procedure, you will use your drops every 2 hours while awake,
	unless otherwise instructed by the recovery room team.
After	☐ If the operating room placed a NON-see-through patch (typically white) over
Surgery	your eye, please do not remove it until the office removes it at your one-day
	post-operative appointment.
	☐ You must have someone stay with you for the first 24 hours after your surgery.
	☐ You must have someone drive you to your one-day post-operative appointment.
	☐ Begin the eye drop schedule provided at your pre-op appointment the DAY
1 Day after	AFTER your procedure.
surgery	□ Please bring all drops to EVERY post-operative appointment.
	☐ You should wear your " Solar Shields " (sunglasses) when outdoors for comfort
	(there is no specified time frame that you must wear the "Solar Shields")
	☐ Wear the clear patch at bedtime and/or naps for 1 week
	□ No make-up, lotions, and/or creams around the eye for 1 week
	☐ Avoid rubbing the operative eye for 2 weeks
For 1 week	☐ Avoid strenuous exercise (running, golf, etc.) for 1 week
following	□ Avoid lifting, pushing, or pulling anything over 25 pounds for 1 week
surgery	☐ Avoid excessive bending with your back for 1 week . (Bending at the knees is preferable)
	☐ Avoid getting water in your operative eye (swimming, spas, etc.) for 3 weeks .
	☐ Showering as normal is ok after 24 hours. Avoid getting soaps and direct water
	streams in the operative eye.
	Although you will be able to see out of the operated eye, your vision may be blurred
	for approximately 1-2 weeks while it heals. After your eye heals, you may need to
	wear glasses for your best vision.
	The following symptoms are normal the first few weeks following the surgery:
	»Scratchy feeling
	»Black arc, shadow, or flicker in your peripheral(temporal) vision
Please Keep	»Aching and/or sensitivity to light
In Mind	»Blurry and /or foggy vision, especially the first few days
	You may use OTC pain relievers, such as ibuprofen, Tylenol, or Aleve, for pain and/
	or discomfort.
	SEVERE PAIN OR SUDDEN VISION LOSS IS NOT NORMAL. Should one or both
